

s the massive influx of camera-toting tourists makes it quite a challenge to find one's footing at Angkor Wat, follow the Oxford-educated scientists behind ABOUTAsia Travel (aboutasiatravel. com) away from Angkor's well-trodden path. Kayak into Prek Toal Core Bird Reserve on Tonle Sap Lake in search of spot-billed pelicans, black-headed ibis and the elusive masked finfoot. Then stay overnight with a Khmer family on a floating village or return to the regal refinements of Amansara, the former guest villa of King Norodom Sihanouk near Siem Reap (amanresorts.com).

Explore like Indiana Jones on ABOUTAsia's three-day trek to rarely-seen temples along the historic Angkorian Highway inside Khulen Promtep Wildlife Sanctuary where the locals have agreed to stop hunting and logging in exchange for guide training

by eco-conservationists at the Sam Veasna Centre. Through the centre, guests can visit the 700-year old façade of Phnom Sondark Temple.

Camp on the banks of an Angkorian baray, or reservoir, a few hundred metres from Prey Veng Temple, on the same scale and significance as Beng Melea, the main temple complex at Angkor, yet virtually unknown.
